

#### **Elder Persons Forum**



As part of our ongoing commitment to serving members at every stage of life, the Cayman Islands Civil Service Association Credit Union was honoured to take part in the Annual Elder Persons Forum, an event dedicated to empowering and informing Cayman's senior population.

This year's presentation was delivered in two engaging parts, led by Jeffrey Wilson, Marius Jackson, and Ryan Walrond, who shared insights on the Credit Union's continued efforts to support older members and protect their financial well-being.

The first part of the presentation focused on what the Credit Union does for its senior members, including:

- Priority service lines and parking for seniors at our branches.
- Personalized account support for transaction authorizations and secure requests.
- Dedicated financial education sessions on budgeting, savings, and planning for retirement.
- Community programs and outreach initiatives that encourage active engagement and belonging.
- The second part highlighted the importance of cybersecurity, equipping attendees with practical tips to recognize scams, protect personal information, and safely navigate online banking and digital communication.





As part of our ongoing commitment to the cooperative principle of "Members helping Members," we are extending a hand of care and support during this difficult time.

Many of our members in Jamaica have faced significant loss and disruption. This moment reminds us of one of the most important cooperative principles: caring for our neighbours.

Our commitment extends beyond borders. While we stand with our members and their families in Jamaica, we also recognize that the effects of natural disasters are felt throughout the Caribbean. As a regional movement built on unity and mutual support, we believe that when one community suffers, we all have a responsibility to help rebuild hope and stability.

To support ongoing relief efforts, we invited members to contribute to our Jamaica Relief Fund. We extend our sincere thanks to all who donated. Through your generosity, a total of \$21,646 was collected and the Credit Union matched these contributions with an additional \$10,000, bringing the total donation to \$31,646.





# From Humble Beginnings: Inspiring the Next Generation



As part of our Road to 50 celebrations, the Credit Union proudly launched its first-ever children's book, From Humble Beginnings, on 5 September, 2025, at Just for Kids Preschool—a fitting venue, as the Credit Union had previously donated the Mrs. Marjorie Beckles Book Nook to the school.

Written by the Credit Union's internal writing team and beautifully illustrated by Michael Mothen, a talented local Caymanian artist, the book captures the Credit Union's roots and Cayman's rich history and heritage. It serves as a heartfelt reminder of how far we've come and how deeply we remain connected to our values of community, cooperation, and belonging.

Following its launch, the book tour continued across Cayman Brac and several schools on Grand Cayman, including Red Bay Primary, John A. ## A Year of Members Helping Members

















As we journey toward our 50th year, and in keeping with our founding principles, the Credit Union continues its commitment to reinvesting in the community we serve. ### Financial Literacy Highlights

Over the past year, the Credit Union strengthened its commitment to financial education through targeted initiatives designed to empower members of all ages. More than 100 students aged 11–19 participated in our two-day summer workshop, gaining practical skills to support informed financial decision-making.

We also had the opportunity to engage with UCCI hospitality students, delivering essential financial literacy sessions focused on budgeting and saving as they prepare to enter the workforce and build their careers. In schools, we launched the pilot Year 6 Financial Literacy Programme at East End Primary, introducing students to foundational money concepts at an early age.

To further expand access, we introduced a new Financial Literacy Portal on our website, offering videos and resources to support members and the wider community through every life stage, from opening a first account to purchasing a home.
